Key Roman Vocabulary

1	Celts	People living in Britain in tribes , including the Iceni, Brigantes and Catuvellauni
2	Citizen	A person with all the rights and protections of a nation or land. In the Roman Empire, only citizens were able to vote.
3	Conquest	Taking control of a place by force, often with an army
4	Emperor	The ruler of an Empire
5	Empire	A group of countries controlled by one ruler or government
6	Legion	A large section of the Roman army, made up of around 5000 soldiers
7	rebellion	An uprising or revolt by people who want to challenge what they believe is unfair treatment by rulers.
8	Roman Empire	The name used for the land that was controlled by the Romans
9	Tribe	A group of people who share the same culture and value

Key Tudor Vocabulary


1	Heir	A person who will inherit the throne when the current King or Queen dies.
2	Monarch	A person who rules over a place, usually a King or Queen
3	Reign	To rule over a country as a monarch
4	Throne	The position of a King or Queen
5	Age of Exploration	A time when European nations began exploring the world. Also known as The Age of Discovery. This was from the 1400s to 1600s.

The first Romans lived in Italy nearly 3000 years ago. They founded the city of Rome in 753 BC and, over the centuries, conquered many lands to create a huge empire.

1	55 and 54 BC	Julius Caesar invades
2	AD 43	Emperor Claudius conquers Britain
3	AD 61	Boudicca rebels
4	AD 122	Hadrian's Wall built

1	Roads	Romans are famous for building long, straight roads
2	Towns	Romans built new towns all over Britain
3	Villas	Wealthy Romans built large homes in the countryside called villas
4	Religion	Romans worshipped their own gods when they came to Britain and later introduced Christianity



Key Tudor Dates and Info
The Tudors were a Welsh-English royal dynasty who ruled England and Wales from 1485 until 1603. England saw significant change under Tudor rule.

1	1485	Henry VII – first Tudor King
2	1509	Henry VIII becomes King
3	1534	Henry VIII forms Church of England
4	1547	Edward VI becomes King
5	1553	Mary I becomes Queen
6	1558	Elizabeth I becomes Queen
7	1588	Spanish Armada defeated
8	1594	Shakespeare's first published play
9	1603	Elizabeth I dies; end of Tudor reign

1	Food	Food was seen as a sign of wealth. Water was not used as a drink as it was thought to be unsafe—people would drink ale instead.
2	Clothes	Tudor clothing was lavish.
3	Houses	Poor houses were made of wattle and daub. Rich houses used symmetrical bricks.
