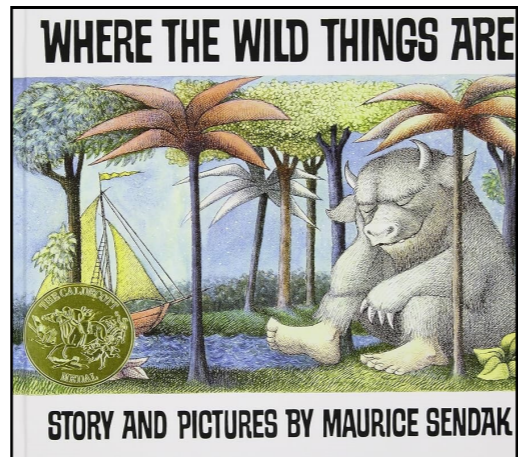


History

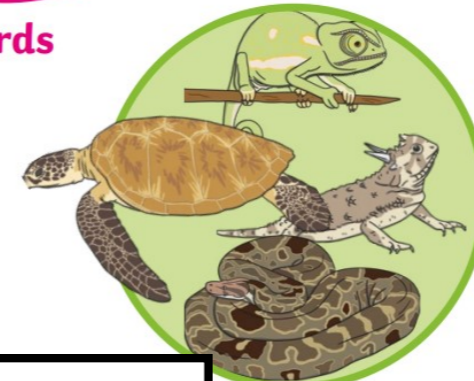

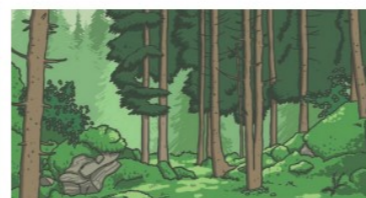

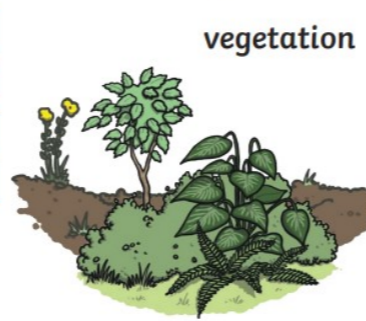
