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Year 6 Spring Term Topic Letter - January 2025

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to back to school! I hope you were able to enjoy a safe and restful break over the holidays.



Our topic this term is 'Blackout'. This is a historical topic, based on World War Two, with strong scientific themes running throughout. The children will learn about important aspects of our national and local history during this historical period, such as The Blitz, evacuation and rationing. With a thoughtful and compassionate approach, we will learn about the countries involved in the war and the impact of the Holocaust. We will look at the personal and social aspects of the impact of WW2, such as: helping others, resilience and differences in beliefs, and consider how we experience these aspects in our day-to-day lives now.

Curriculum overview for the term ahead:

Maths: Ratio, Algebra, Decimals, Percentages, Area, Perimeter, Volume, Statistics

English: Literary Study of Texts to Inspire Writing (Letters from the Lighthouse, Rose Blanche)

Science: Circulatory System, Digestive System

Computing: Coding, Stop Motion

Topic: 'Blackout' (WW2, Local History Study)

RE: Judaism

PE: Coach Keeley/ Arsenal

French: French Fables, Hobbies, Leisure

PSHE: Mental Health, Employment, Philosophy

Music: Texture, Composition

D&T: Textiles, food Technology **Art:** Shape, Shadow, Shading

P.E will take place every **Monday** with coach Keely and every **Wednesday** with the Arsenal coaches. Please send your child to school in their P.E. kit on these days.

Home learning will be ongoing in Year 6, set every **Friday** and due on the following Friday. This will usually consist of a maths task and a reading comprehension task.

Spellings will be set every **Monday** to be memorised for a spelling test on the following Monday.

Children should continue to keep up with their online tasks on *Mathletics* and *Times Table Rockstars*.

It is essential that children are reading at least 3 days per week at home. They are expected to record their reading in their reading diaries, which parents should sign to acknowledge. Please can they bring their diary and the book they are reading into school **every day**.
