Fleet Primary School Calendar Competition 2025

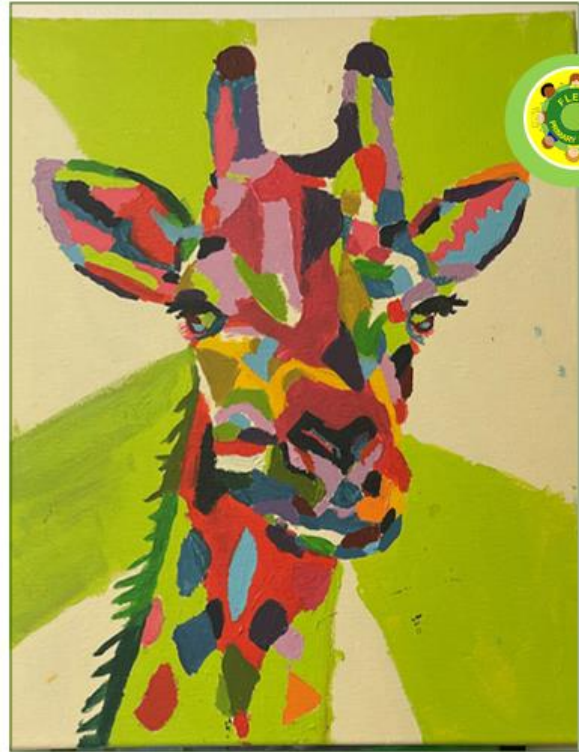
This year's theme... Famous buildings and landmarks around the world!
