This weeks attendance has taken a slight dip with overall attendance dropping from 94.7% to 91.4%. Well done to Year 6 who are still coming in at the top with 95.2% this week. Year 2 following closely behind at 95% and Years 5 and 3 just behind them both with 94%. Year 4, Year 1 and Reception are quite low with 90% and under—as they continue to struggle with illness and other challenges. Our overall attendance for the year is 93.5%, so lets keep pushing towards our target—we have one more half term of the school year left to improve!














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
