There are always challenges to be faced from practical ones like the number of adults available or the money we have for resources, but the one constant is every member of staff's desire to do the best they can to support the children and make the learning fun, meaningful and impactful. Next week, the end of year events continue with our 'Wellbeing Week'. The culmination of this is Rec-Y6 sports day, this year at the running track on the Heath. Weekly Attendance Award

We remain at 93.7% for the year, still some way below the 96% target but we are continuing to see better attendance across the majority of the school. Well done to Y4, Y5 and Y2 - all 96% or above this week! After a very difficult year, Year 1 still showing strong having won the last 3 weeks, they're above 95% this week. For the week we are slightly up on last week with 94.3%.

At this point in the year Year 5 are still the only class to achieve 96% for the year to date. Year 2 and Year 6 both close and above 95%. With a few more weeks to go, there is still time for each class
