Message from the head:

I'd like to start this week with a massive thankyou to all of you for your renewed efforts in getting children to school on time and everyday. Attendance and Punctuality are excellent this week. All the research shows that the children who are in school regularly outperform those who miss school—this is seen in differences as little as children below 96% not doing as well as those above. We also know from research that primary school attendance is better than secondary which means that primary school is often the best it gets in terms of attendance so even more important that children get off to a good start and form good habits early. This week I had a number conversations with some of you to consider putting yourselves forward for the vacant Parent Governor positions we sent letters about recently. This is a really rewarding role and a chance to support the school and the directions we take moving forward. I really hope some of you will go for these positions. We want the governing body to represent the school community so need your help to do that.

On that note, can I also make a shout out for the PTA. The current group of dedicated parents really need more support to help them with planning and running the many events through the year. It would be great if more of you could get involved in the work they do. The Fleet Community is a wonderful one and I know lots of you have many great ideas that would be good to share. Please do reach out via the office if you are not sure who to talk to and would like to get more involved—many hands make light work and so the more supporting the work of the PTA the less there is to do individually. This week we had a wonderful example of the community coming together for the Year 6 fundraising 'Movie Night' - it goes to show that fun events don't need to be complicated and bring so much to the children.

Next week we will be waving off the Year 5 as they go on their week long residential trip to Sayer's Croft. This is a real 'rights of passage' event with it being the first time many of them

will have spent time away from their families. What better way to do that than to be with their friends. I still remember my own school journey and what a fantastic experience it was. I know, as a parent myself, how challenging it can be for us to let go but its part of letting the children grow and develop their independence. With this trip and then the Year 6 trip to Gower, we ensure that the children leave primary school more than ready to take on the levels of independence needed at secondarv.

Lets get everyone here on time everyday so no child misses their own learning or disturbs/delays the learning of others. Thank you for your continued support.

Weekly Attendance Award

What a fantastic week in terms of attendance thank you too all of you who have helped ensure your children have been as much as possible to maximise their learning opportunities. After a few very strong weeks from them Year 6 have taken the crown again and this time with this terms first 100% - brilliant! Also fantastic is the fact that all classes except one (Reception) are above the target of 96% (Y5, Y1, Y4 and Y3 made it to 98%!). Overall for this week attendance is 97.4% - comfortably above the whole school target of 96%. This week's excellent attendance has moved attendance for the whole year up 0.5% to 95.7% - edging closer to the 96% target. Thank you for this week and working with us on maximising time in school. Lets see if we can build on this moving forward and continue to improve overall attendance.
































The Magic Paintbrush











































Year 6 Fundraising - Movie Night
