General Health & Safety Reminders...



Well done to Year 6 (again!) along with Reception and YEar 3 - none of these classes had any children late with week - brilliant! Year 2 and Year 5 close behind with only 1 late each. Year 4 and Year 1 definitie room for improvement with 11 lates across the two classes.

This represents a drop overall from last week with only 13 across the school compared to 18 last week and 16 the week before. This number is also significantly down from our high of 26 before the Half Term break, so thank you for your renewed efforts and supporting your children to get here on time.

If you are struggling to get your child into school on time, please do reach out to us for advice and support. We want to ensure your child isn't missing out on the key information given by the teachers at the start of the day and also avoid the awkward feeling of arriving late into class when all their friends are have started their work and are ready to learn.

Remember, classrooms are open from 8.45am so children (and adults) do not need to wait in the cold or rain outside. The QUBE in the Junior playground is also open from 8am for breakfast club. Lets get everyone here on time everyday so no child misses their own learning or disturbs/delays the learning of others. Thank you for your continued support.
















































This week at Fleet...



Cycle Training with Y5

After Year 6 last week, this week it was the turn of Year 5 to take on the Level 2 bikeability course. The course aim is to take the children who can already ride a bike and train them in safe cycling and teach them the signally required to be able to cycle on roads. After time in the playground they get out onto the local roads under the guidance of the two instructors to put into practice what they learnt in the playground. We are pleased to say all three groups made it out on the roads and were able to achieve the goal of the course.

We aim to offer the course again to the children when they are in Y6 next year so any who weren't able to do it this time, or aren't currently able to cycle at Level 1, there will be another opportunity.






