I'd like to start this week with a huge thank you to Lisa Bradley and Anna Wheatley for there dedication this year (and previous) in ensuring we can take part in the Camden School's Football competition - standing on the sidelines at Talacre in the winter is not how many would choose to spend their Tuesday's after work, but it means so much to the children to be able to take part. Also, amazing thanks to parent Tom Looney who has added his coaches touch to supporting the children in this and last season's competition. Our last league fixtures were this week and I am pleased to say well done to the boys team who have amassed enough points that they cannot be overtaken and have won the League! We're very proud of both the boys and the girls team for their dedication and effort. I finished this week at the Annual Camden Head Teachers conference. It has been a great opportunity to hear some inspirational speakers and hear about some of the latest developments in education, bringing back ideas to discuss with staff at Fleet and maybe move forward with. Finally, I'd like to thank you all for your continued efforts in terms of attendance. Camden recently published some data based on last term and I was delighted to see that the improvement we saw in the Autumn Term - improving on Autumn 2023-24 by over 1.5% - was the biggest improvement seen by any Camden Primary School. Here's hoping Spring and Summer continues to see improvement and we can get back to finishing the year over our target of 96% as we were pre-covid. Good levels of attendance is one of the key determiners of good educational outcomes. Have a lovely weekend and see you all on Monday.





General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Please do not prop open the main gate to the school site either before or after school. If there is not a member of staff there, the gate should be kept closed.

Lates are creeping up from 16 last week to 21. Well done to Year 6 who achieved no lates at all, followed by Year 5 and Year 3 with just 1 late each and Year 1 with 2 lates. Reception, Year 4 and Year 2 all had 5 or more lates this week and need to improve.

If your child has been repeatedly late, you will have received a message letting you know how many occasions your child has been late this year. If you are finding getting to school on time difficult, then you may need to think about your morning routine and what could be done to ensure this doesn't happen again. If you need any support with this, please do contact us.

Remember, classrooms are open from 8.45am so children (and adults) do not need to wait in the cold or rain outside. The QUBE in the Junior playground is also open from 8am for Breakfast Club.


Thank you to all of those children (and parents) that continue to get their children into school on time. We appreciate your continued support.

Well done to Year 6 - top of the attendance tree this week with 100%, they have jumped up a massive 4.2%. 4 out of our 7 classes were above 95%, with Year 3 coming in second with 99.2%, which is a 3.4% increase on last week, followed by Year 1 with 96.3% and Year 2 with 95.3%, which is also a 3.4% increase. Well done to them. Year 4 and Year 5 had a bit of a dip in their attendance this week, with Year 4 dropping by 3.1% and Year 5 dropping by 4.6% - let's see if we can get it back to where it was next week.

Our overall attendance for the week has increased slightly by 0.5% (just 0.1% below our target of 96%) - I am sure we can get our weekly average up to 96% next week! Our overall for the year so far has stayed the same at 94.9%.

Our School Inclusion Officer from Camden, Allison will be coming in next week to meet with parents regarding attendance and punctuality. If your child's individual attendance falls below a certain point, Camden will arrange a meeting with you to discuss any barriers and how we can support you in getting your child into school.

Please remember to let us know each day, by 9am if your child is unable to attend school. Thank you to all those children (and parents) showing resilience at this time of year when there are a number of bugs floating around and the weather is often less than inviting when we step out of our front doors in the morning. Remember to ensure that all children come in with warm coats, hats and gloves on these very cold days and that they have a waterproof coat if rain is forecast.
