Message from the Head...

I can't quite believe it's the last newsletter of 2024 - this term has really flown by! As we approach the New Year it's a natural time to reflect on the past year - successes and challenges and look ahead to the coming year with excitement and optimism.

2024 was a year we saw a number of teachers who had been here for a long time move on. leaving London, with others going on maternity leave, in the middle of the year I did worry about ensuring we had stability and wonder how we would cover the amazing staff we lost. However, I should not have been worried. We were able to recruit incredibly well and the staff who have come in are now valued members of the community and feel like they've always been here. They believe in the 'Fleet Way' - valuing creativity and putting the child at the heart of all we do. The remaining staff, where they have moved into new roles, are flourishing too. As a result we've made a really strong start to this academic year with the school feeling really settled and children purposeful and engaged in their learning. This term has been a long one but you wouldn't know it for the levels of enthusiasm the children have showed throughout and they should be proud of all they've achieved. In terms of stand out moments this term for me it's hard to top the Junior Show and their version of Matilda. Other notable events for me include the time I spent on School Journey with the brilliant Year 5 children and watching the development and bravery of Year 4 through their project with Scarabeus Aerial Theatre. Seeing the confidence of the voungest children increasing through the term too has been very special - I love going into the infant classes - the children are so keen to show me what they have been doing and so proud of their work. Everytime I do a parent tour and we come through it really helps prospective parents see how much our voungest children enjoy being in school, learning and developing with their friends in an environment they feel completely safe in. I would also have to put up there with my top Autumn term memories watching the Year 5 and 6 football team in their match against Eleanor Palmer (last year's champions) a few weeks ago. The way the children passed the ball and played as a team was a joy to watch, it encapsulated everything we try to instill in the children that while individually we might do well, it's when we work together, as a team, relying on each other, trusting each other, each with a part to play, that we can achieve great things. Moving forward into 2025 I am looking forward to many more successes and memories from your wonderful children and my fantastic staff. Have a great Christmas and New Year and enjoy any time off you get.





General Health & Safety Reminders...

Well done to Year 5 year 5 who have finished the term on top of the attendance tree with a fantastic 97.2%. Closely followed by Year 6 and Year 3 - both also above the target level of 96%. Year 4 just miss out on hitting the target.

Overall, we have seen an improvement in overall attendance this term (over a percentage point on last year). It's a shame that an increase in illness and holidays taken in term time has pulled us down below the 95% level overall - we have been above it for much of this term which put us above the Camden average and as one of the top 10 schools each week.

When you look at the table below you can see that every class has improved on the same period last year. Thank you for your continuing support to ensure that missing school learning opportunities is kept to a minimum.

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A huge well done to the children listed above who all have 100% attendance for this term. 49 children achieved this feat (25% of the school) up on 44 this time last year. Given the high attendance seen in Year 5 and 6 it's no surprise that they are the two classes with the most children with 100% attendance.

Termly Punctuality Award

It has been a very successful term in terms of punctuality with overall number of lates down significantly on this time last year - see table below - from 419 in Autumn term last year to 189 this year - less than half as many - fantastic! Year 4 are, by a long way, the worst class in terms of lates so definitely work to be done to improve but even they have seen a drop compared to last year.

Thank you for all your hard work supporting your children to get to school on time there are 114 children who have not been late once - almost 60% of the school (at this point last year is was only 102). Let's keep it up into the Spring Term and beyond.

The children to the right have not ever been late this academic year. We are very proud of them all for their dedication and for excelling in ensuring they do not disturb their own or anyone else's learning by arriving late.

3rd Place: Mia (Y6) reciting all American States in Alphabetical order in less than 30 seconds!








