Message from the Head...

This week Becca and I carried out our pupil topic conferences. This is where we meet with a small group of children from each class, look together at their topic books and talk about all the things they have learnt during the term. Its one of the way we can monitor the impact of the topic learning. It was wonderful to hear from so many of them that they have their topic snapshots up on their fridges and how they refer to them at home to help with their retention of the key facts. It was also brilliant hearing how much knowledge they have retained and the clear enthusiasm for learning through topic that they have. Children told us all about their different topics, from interesting facts and explanations about Shakespeare, Geology and rock types to how a volcano and plate tectonics work. We heard about the Romans and the Celts up to the Tudors and Henry VIII's wives.

It was clear from our discussions the impact on retention of the trips the teachers plan to link in with subject knowledge and making the learning come alive as well as the creative approach taken in classes from making Tudor roses out of clay to designing and building viking shields. Many talked about how much they enjoyed performing in their class assemblies and how proud they were of themselves for being able to remember all their lines. Some were definitely helped in remembering key knowledge as they sang some of their show songs where the lines contained the knowledge they wanted to remember.

At Fleet we really believe this topic approach both inspires as well as supports learning. Life is about making links - taking things learnt in one area and being able to apply it in another context and the topics support the children to do this. If you ever lose the topic snapshot remember they can always be found by looking back on ParentHub to the start of term when it was sent out or going on our website to the curriculum page where they are all available. Have a great weekend and I look forward to seeing you next week - can't wait for the infant show and Winter Fair both on Friday!





General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Please do not prop open the main gate to the school site either before or after school. If there is not a member of staff there, the gate should be kept closed.

It was a disappointing picture overall this week for punctuality but it should be noted that this is effectively down to two classes and a small number of children from those classes being late more than once.

Overall we had 25 lates - the most in a single week for some time.

Well done to Years 2 and 3 (no lates - fantastic!) and to Year 6 and Year 5 - only 3 lates between them. Year 3 also low with 3 lates all week. Well done to those in Reception and Year 4 who were here on time everyday which is the vast majority.

If you are finding getting to school on time difficult and your child has arrived late on more than one occasion then you may need to think about your morning routine and what could be done to ensure this doesn't happen again. We are happy to help with this.

We want to ensure your child isn't missing out on the key information given by the teachers at the start of the day and also avoid the awkward feeling of arriving late into class when all their friends are have started their work and are ready to learn.

Remember, classrooms are open from 8.45am so children (and adults) do not need to wait in the cold or rain outside. The QUBE in the Junior playground is also open from 8am for breakfast club. Thank you for your continued support.

Well done to Year 4, coming top this week with 96.7% - second week in a row they have come out on top! Year 1 and Year 5 weren't far behind them this week - also both above the target level of 96%. Overall this week we have seen another slight dip overall - below 95% again (2 weeks in a row now). This has also pulled the average for the year down to 95.4%. Please remember to let us know each day a child is absent that they will not be in. This is mainly due this week to Reception absence. Having been so strong over the last few weeks a number of illnesses in that class has hit them. Hopefully this is just a blip and those children who've been ill bounce back quickly. Remember to ensure that all children come in with warm coats, hats and gloves on these very cold days and that they have a waterproof coat if rain is forecast. So far 3 classes are still above the 96% target for the year - Year 3, Year 5 and Year 6. Year 4 are still very close - half a percent away. Don't forget, if there is a reason you are finding it difficult to get your child into school, you can contact us for advice and support. We want to work with you to help your children attend school regularly and to ensure they get the best out of their educational experience here at Fleet. Thank you all for your continued support and the strong start to the year we've made overall.






























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Year 4




















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
