- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.
- If you change phone numbers or addresses please let us know immediately. We need your current contact details.

- If you are in the junior playground after school, please supervise your children carefully and be mindful that the equipment in the junior playground is designed for older children and is unsafe for little ones. Other playground equipment (balls etc) is not for use after school.
- If you need to walk between the main school and the Nursery please use the path rather than cutting through the hall or corridor.

Weekly Punctuality Award

Punctuality Matters – Let's Improve Lates! Lates have gone up this week, from 18 to 22, and we need to work together to improve this and stay consistent. Being on time is so important for a smooth start to the school day!

Here's how each year group did this week:

- Year 6, Year 4 & Reception: Great effort with just 2 lates each keep it up!
- Year 3 & Year 1: Each had 3 lates. For Year 3, that's an increase of 3, and Year 1 has stayed the same as last week. Let's aim to improve here!
- Year 5: Had 4 lates, which is an increase of 1.
- Year 2: Recorded 6 lates, an increase of 1.

While we've been heading in the right direction, the number of lates has increased slightly. If your child has been repeatedly late this week, you will receive a message letting you know how often this has happened.

Struggling to Arrive on Time?

If mornings are a bit tricky, try reviewing your routine to see if small changes could make a big difference. Here are some tips to help:

- Prepare school bags and clothes the night before with your child.
- Set alarms a bit earlier to allow time for a calmer start.
- Have breakfast ready or quick to prepare for a smooth morning and remember, they can always have their morning bagel at school.

- Classrooms open at 8:45am, so children and adults don't have to wait outside in the cold or rain.


