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It was a disappointing picture overall this week for punctuality (second week in a row) 26 lates is the highest in a very long time as our punctuality has been much better this year on the whole.

Well done to Year 1 with ibky 1 late. Also special mentions for Years 2, 3 and 6 who week on week have been low and even this week when numbers are up aer still pretty low.

Reception and Year 4, we know you can do better (and have been better earlier in the year).

If you are finding getting to school on time difficult and your child has arrived late on more than one occasion then you may need to think about your morning routine and what could be done to ensure this doesn't happen again. We are happy to help with this.

Remember, classrooms are open from 8.45am so children (and adults) do not need to wait in the cold or rain outside. The QUBE in the Junior playground is also open from 8am for breakfast club. Thank you for your continued support.

Well done to Year 5 and Year - joint winners this week with 94.7%. Overall this week we have seen another dip overall - below 92% - which is very low given the fantastic run we have been on for more of this year. This has pulled down the average for the year to 95.2%. Please remember to let us know each day a child is absent that they will not be in. This week's lower average figure is mainly due to the very low attendance in Year 1 this week but no class made it above the 96% target. Thankyou to all those children (and parents) showing resilience at this time of year when there are a number of bugs floating around and the weather is often less than inviting when we step out of our doors in the morning. Remember to ensure that all children come in with warm coats, hats and gloves on these very cold days and that they have a waterproof coat if rain is forecast. 3 classes are still above the 96% target for the year - Year 3, Year 5 and Year 6. Year 4 are still very close - half a percent away. Don't forget, if there is a reason you are finding it difficult to get your child into school, you can contact us for advice and support. We want to work with you to help your children attend school regularly and to ensure they get the best out of their educational experience here at Fleet. Thank you all for your continued support and the strong start to the year we've made overall.



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


