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General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Don't send in any snacks or food containing nuts we are a nut free school.
- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.

Mornings can be a rush, but small changes can make a big difference! Here are some simple ways to make getting to school on time easier:


Prep the night before – Lay out clothes, pack bags, and fill water bottles in advance.



Why it's so long-lived?

- The Great Red Spot's longevity may be due to Augiter's lack of a solid surface, which would dissipate the storm's energy.



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
