
### Message from the Head...

We have somehow almost reached the end of this half term - one more week to go! Being quite a short half term means that we have been very busy fitting everything in.

This week has been Children's Mental Health Week. This years theme was 'Know Yourself, Grow Yourself'. We spend a lot of time in primary schools encouraging children and supporting them to recognise and understand their emotions so that they can then react to them in appropriate ways. Recognising that all different emotions are valid, the key is how we react to those different feelings. One of the resources promoted during this week, and one many classes used, was the Pixar 'Inside Out' films. They are a really good, child friendly way, to introduce different emotions to children. Well worth a watch with your children if you haven't seen them and great for discussions around emotions. Take some time to ask your children about their week and any of the lessons they did around Mental Health week.

The weather is very changeable at the moment - one day cold and dry, the next warmer but wet. We try to get the children out for their playtime and lunchtime as much as possible despite the poorer weather so please make sure they are coming in prepared for any change in the weather.

# General Health & Safety Reminders...

- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.
- If you change phone numbers or addresses please let us know immediately. We need your current contact details.
- Please do not prop open the main gate to the school site either before or after school. If there is not a member of staff there, the gate should be kept closed.
- If adults need to use the toilet on the school premises, even if accompanying a child, they must use the staff toilets in the corridor.
- The site is open to parents from 8am for breakfast club, please wait until then, even if a member of staff is buzzed in whilst you're waiting (some parents have been coming in before 8 and leaving their children in the qube unattended)
- If you are in the junior playground after school, please supervise your children carefully and be mindful that the equipment in the junior playground is designed for older children and is unsafe for little ones.
   Other playground equipment (balls etc) is not for use after school.
- If you need to walk between the main school and the Nursery please use the path rather than cutting through the hall or corridor.

**Attendance Update – Well Done Year 5!** A huge congratulations to Year 5 for topping the attendance chart this week with an impressive 97%! You've kept steady with last week's amazing score—keep up the great work!

- Reception: In second place with 96.6%, showing an awesome 3.1% improvement from last week—well done, Reception!
- Year 2: In third place with 96%, staying the same as last week.














# Spring Term Home Learning Projects for Years 2-6
